Gospel Reading—Mark 9:17-31

The insert in your bulletin is the Apolytikion (Hymn) of Synaxis of the 12 Apostles. Beginning today, we will sing Apostoli Agii, in Greek and English.

Τὸ φαιδρὸν τῆς ἀναστάσεως κήρυγμα, ἐκ τοῦ Ἁγγέλου μαθοῦσαι αἱ τοῦ Κυρίου Μαθήτριαι, καὶ τὴν προγονικὴν ἀπόφασιν ἀπορῥίψασαι, τοῖς Ἀποστόλοις καυχώμεναι ἔλεγον Ἐσκύλευται ὁ θάνατος, ἠγέρθη Χριστὸς ὁ Θεός, δωρούμενος τῷ κόσμῳ τὸ μέγα ἔλεος.

Resurrectional Apolytikion. - Mode 4.

When the women disciples of the Lord heard the Angel joyously proclaim the resurrection, they cast aside the ancestral verdict, and boasting in glory they said to the Apostles, "Death has been despoiled! Christ God has risen, granting the great mercy to the world!"

The Epistle—Hebrews 6:13-20

Brethren, when God made a promise to Abraham, since he had no one greater by whom to swear, he swore to himself, saying, "Surely I will bless you and multiply you." And thus Abraham, having patiently endured, obtained the promise. Men indeed swear by a greater than themselves, and in all their disputes an oath is final for confirmation. So when God desired to show more convincingly to the heirs of the promise the unchangeable character of his purpose, he interposed with an oath, so that through two unchangeable things, in which it is impossible that God should prove false, we who have fled for refuge might have strong encouragement to seize the hope set before us. We have this as a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul, a hope that enters into the inner shrine behind the curtain, where Jesus has gone as a forerunner on our behalf, having become a high priest for ever after the order of Melchizedek.

The Gospel—Mark 9:17-31

At that time, a man came to Jesus kneeling and saying: "Teacher, I brought my son to you, for he has a dumb spirit; and wherever it seizes him it dashes him down; and he foams and grinds his teeth and becomes rigid; and I asked your disciples to cast it out, and they were not able." And he answered them, "O faithless generation, how long am I to be with you? How long am I to bear with you? Bring him to me." And they brought the boy to him; and when the spirit saw him, immediately it convulsed the boy, and he fell on the ground and rolled about, foaming at the mouth. And Jesus asked his father, "How long has he had this?" And he said, "From childhood. And it has often cast him into the fire and into the water, to destroy him; but if you can do anything, have pity on us and help us." And Jesus said to him, "If you can! All things are possible to him who believes." Immediately the father of the child cried out and said, "I believe; help my unbelief!" And when Jesus saw that a crowd came running together, he rebuked the unclean spirit, saying to it, "You dumb and deaf spirit, I command you, come out of him, and never enter him again." And after crying out and convulsing him terribly, it came out, and the boy was like a corpse; so that most of them said, "He is dead." But Jesus took him by the hand and lifted him up, and he arose. And when he had entered the house, his disciples asked him privately. "Why could we not cast it out?" And he said to them, "This kind cannot be driven out by anything but prayer and fasting." They went on from there and passed through Galilee. And he would not have any one know it; for he was teaching his disciples, saying to them, "The Son of man will be delivered into the hands of men, and they will kill him; and when he is killed, after three days he will rise."

Today's Artoklasia is celebrated to thank Holy Apostles' ministries for their service and to also recognize these outreach projects performed during the first quarter, January through March 2024:

- GOYA Made kits for priests to distribute when visiting sick parishioners in the hospital. The kits, part of the nonprofit "Chrisy's Kits", started by Ariana Mandelaris, a Holy Apostles GOYA member, include cards and prayer rocks painted by GOYA members to help brighten hospital stays.
- Jr. GOYA Made cards to be distributed to hospitalized children from Holy Apostles.
- Missions: Feed6 Challenge Packed 100,000 meals and donated to Project Hope.
- Missions/Philoptochos: Collected food for Project HOPE.
- Parish Council: Hosted the Macaronatha Luncheon on Cheesefare Sunday. All free will donations received will be sent to the Orthodox Church of Albania to provide scholarships for children to attend the summer Family Camp run by Nathan and Gabriela Hoppe.
- Parish Retreat Youth activity: Made 20 laundry kits for BEDS Plus Care clients. BEDS Plus Care helps vulnerable individuals stabilize their lives through housing and supportive services.
- Philoptochos: Collected children's books for Bernie's Book Bank, a group that distributes books to under-served children throughout Chicagoland; made fleece blankets for their Blankets of Love collection, which were given to seniors during Valentine's Day Pillars and Rocks visits; established a "comfort closet" for needy students in a nearby community as part of their Operation Classroom initiative by donating basic necessities and a cabinet to store the items; donated \$1000 to STARS Family Services for their Art Study Program.
- Stewardship Fifth Saturday Serve: Made baskets for elementary and middle school graduates and final exam survival kits for college graduates of York Community Resource Center of Lombard.
- Stewardship: Hosted Trivia Night and donated all proceeds to the Westchester Food Pantry.




