Transformed by the Lord

Have you ever failed someone or disappointed a spouse, boss, friend, or fellow employee?

What if we let down the One who gave His life for us and disappointed the Lord as St. Peter did?

On June 29, we honor him as well as St. Paul. "Petros" (Peter) is another name for rock. "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God," (*Matthew 16:16*) Peter proclaimed publicly. "You are Peter, and on this rock, I will build my Church," (*Matthew 16:18*) the Lord replied.

After this "rock" boasted that he would never leave Jesus, Peter watched from a distance as the Lord was led away. Standing by the fire to warm himself, Peter saw the High Priest try Jesus.

He had three opportunities to boldly stand up for the Lord. Three times he denied Him. When the rooster crowed, Peter wept bitterly - a failure.

Imagine how Peter must have felt when the resurrected Lord appeared to him. Although Peter rejoiced that Jesus was alive, he wondered how their relationship would change.

Transformed by the Lord *(continued)*

Sometimes we sin and wander far away from the Lord. We may think, "Does God still love me after what I have done? Is there still a place and purpose for me in His Kingdom?"

We overestimate our strength while underestimating our need for others and the strength of the Holy Spirit. Peter was sure that he would never forsake the Lord.

Sometimes we make claims that we will never sin as others do. Peter demonstrates the danger in thinking this way. The Church Fathers warn us to always be vigilant and watchful.

David never thought he would commit adultery. Solomon never thought he would be caught up in idolatry. Peter never dreamed that he would deny knowing Christ.

Paul warns us: "let him who thinks he stands take heed lest he fall" (1 Corinthians 10:12). Peter was impetuous and overconfident.

The Rock was not as strong as he thought and was humbled by the poor decisions that he made. This made him honest about himself and his true spiritual condition.

Peter humbly met our loving; compassionate Lord and He restored him. In the Gospel of John, Jesus asked Peter if he loved Him three times.

The Scriptures utilize two different Greek words for love. First, He asked, "Simon, son of Jonah, do you love (agape {αγαπη}) Me more than these?" "Agape" is the highest form of unconditional, self-emptying love. Peter could not claim such a lofty love.

He responded, "You know that I love (philo {φιλω}) you." "Philo" is a lesser form of love or brotherly affection. In other words, "Lord, you know that I like you."

Peter was honest. He admitted that he was not sure of his level of love for the Lord. The second time yielded the same question and response. The third time, the Lord changed the word for love and asked, "Simon, son of Jonah, do you love (phileis {φιλεις}) Me?" "Simon, do you like Me?" Jesus condescended to Peter's weakness. Our Lord accepted the level of love Peter offered.

Sometimes we feel like Peter. The Lord is far from us, and we have lost the desire to pray, read the Bible and attend Church. We may be frustrated or angry with God.

Honesty is important when dealing with the Lord. When Peter acknowledged his true feelings toward the Lord, Jesus met Him right where he was.

"The Church is a spiritual hospital" according to St. John Chrysostom. Our doctor can only heal us when we admit and profess our health problem. We are cured when we acknowledge our weakness, illness and need of help. **Peter failed three times. Each time he was restored and healed by the Lord.**

Later Peter experienced Pentecost – the coming of the Holy Spirit. "I will give them one heart and put a new spirit within them; I will remove the heart of stone from their flesh and give them a heart of flesh, so that they may follow my statutes and keep my ordinances and obey them" (Ezekial 11:19).

After his restoration by the Risen Lord and experiencing the descent of the Holy Spirit, Peter preached in Judea, Antioch, and parts of Asia. According to the Book of Acts, 3,000 people converted to Christ after Peter's powerful sermon!

This former denier of Christ wrote two epistles and, in the end, offered his life for Christ. **It all began with Peter's allowing the Lord to change and restore him!**

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE APRIL 2024 PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

PC SECRETARY: VAL DRANIAS

Norm Pomrening called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm. Opening Prayer: Father Georgiou. Norm Pomrening recited Mission Statement. Approval of Minutes: Val Dranias – Jim Maragos moved to accept the minutes of 3/21/24 and Patty Pappas seconded. Unanimous approval.

Correspondence: Val Dranias – Thank you from Westchester Food Pantry for our donation of \$800 from our Trivia Night; Thank you from Marina Dimas for our \$1000 donation for non-alcoholic beverages for YAL Chicago Conference (she included pics); Request for a donation from the Westchester Fire Department for student materials for Westchester students created by the National Fire Safety Council. Nick Kirkeles moved that we donate \$300 to provide materials for 100 students, Jim Maragos seconded. Unanimous approval; Letter from Metropolitan Nathanael regarding the future Metropolis Center. The letter expressed concern that Holy Apostles did not notify the Metropolis in writing that we would not be making a proposal. Norm has responded to His Eminence.

Ecclesiastical Report: Father Georgiou – Father Nicholas presented chapter 22 of *Lenten Spring* by Thomas Hopko for discussion. It discussed the lust for power. The power and the glory are to obey God and believe that power is fulfilled in meekness, and authority in service.

Ministries

Finance: Steve Milak - Treasurer's Report – total cash in Capital and Operating Accounts as of 3/31/24 is \$1,326,233.15.

Stewardship & Welcoming: Sandy Pihos - Stewardship Report for March

Our 482 YTD pledges are 1% more than the 479 we had by the end of March 2023. Our 462K pledged is 2% more than the \$642K we had received by the end of March 2023. Our 447K collected is 4% more than the \$461K we had received by the end of March 2023. Our median pledge is \$700, 12% less than the \$800 YTD March 2023 median pledge. Our average pledge of \$1,353 is 1% more than the \$1,340 YTD March 2023 average pledge.

Stewardship/Welcoming Committee Meeting Report: June 29 Fifth Saturday Serve project will be Operation Backpack with Philoptochos. Looking for schools that would benefit from the program. August 31 Fifth Saturday Serve will be activity kits for Lurie Children's Center, Westchester. Spring Fest is on the calendar for Saturday, May 18. The 5K run will be June 15 at 8:30 am. The proceeds will go to Lurie's of Westchester with the approval of the Missions Committee. White Sox Greek Heritage Night is Thursday, June 6. Deadline to purchase tickets is April 26. The Ministry Booklet has been emailed to the Stewardship and Welcoming Committee for preview. It will also be mailed out to Ministry chairs for review of their descriptions. Getting printing quotes for color copies. This will be an asset for the Ministry Fair in September

Greek School: Lena Theotikos

New furniture needed – Updates in furniture for the classrooms will cost \$4200. Coordination with Sunday School is also needed. Lena Theotikos moved that tuition for 2024-25 school year be the same for members and non-members. It will be raised to \$950 for 1 child, \$850 for the second child, \$750 for the third child. Val Dranias seconded. Unanimous approval. Motion to budget up to \$800 for 2025 parade float. Unanimous approval. Motion to budget up to \$2,000 for furniture needs – tabled. Formal proposal will be made in the future.

Missions: Norm Pomrening reported that Feed6 – 1/11/24. Project Mexico – James Clohessy - Motion made by Steve Milak to fund up to \$1500 matching funds to what James collects for Project Mexico, Sandy Pihos seconded. Unanimous approval.
