Epistle Reading—Romans 6:18-23 Reader: Renee Govostis **Gospel Reading**—Matthew 8:5-13 Sermon: Nathan Hoppe

Today's Artoklasia is celebrated to thank Holy Apostles' ministries for their service and to also recognize the outreach projects performed by the following ministries from April through June 2024:

- Good Friday Youth Retreat: Students in kindergarten through 5th grade assembled kits for children with cancer for the "Childhood Cancer Warriors" foundation and made cards to be included with Chrissy's kits, which are given by priests to sick people they visit in the hospital.
- Vacation Bible School: Pre-school through 3rd grade students made cards and painted positive affirmation rocks to be included with Chrissy's kits.
- Vacation Bible School/Philoptochos: Students donated 95 bags and boxes of cereal to be distributed to the Hillside Food Pantry. Fourth and fifth grade students made 26 blankets for the Animal Rescue Foundation in Wheaton.
- **Fifth Saturday Serve/Philoptochos:** Packed backpacks filled with school supplies and water bottles for underserved students in kindergarten through 8th grade in nearby communities for the Operation Classroom initiative.
- Missions: Organized the annual 5k run. All proceeds were donated to the Philoxenia House in Rochester, Minnesota.
- Missions/Philoptochos: Food collection for Project HOPE.
- Missions/Philoptochos/Stewardship: Lenten service project to assemble summer season kits for BEDS-Plus individuals.
- Philoptochos: Assembled specially formulated meals at Feed My Starving Children, prepared and distributed sack lunches for the Feed the Hungry initiative at Annunciation Cathedral, made Mother's Day baskets filled with blankets, lip balm, tea and water bottles for Thumbuddy Special, an organization that supports special needs children and their families, and collected professional women's attire for the Poised for Success clothing drive.

The Epistle – Romans 6:18-23

Brethren, having been set free from sin, you have become slaves of righteousness. I am speaking in human terms, because of the weakness of your flesh. For just as you once yielded your members to impurity and to greater and greater iniquity, so now yield your members to righteousness for sanctification. When you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. But then what return did you get from the things of which you are now ashamed? The end of those things is death. But now that you have been set free from sin and have become slaves of God, the return you get is sanctification and its end, eternal life. For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

The Gospel – Matthew 8:5-13

At that time, as Jesus entered Capernaum, a centurion came forward to him, beseeching him and saying, "Lord, my servant is lying paralyzed at home, in terrible distress." And he said to him, "I will come and heal him." But the centurion answered him, "Lord, I am not worthy to have you come under my roof; but only say the word, and my servant will be healed. For I am a man under authority, with soldiers under me; and I say to one, 'Go,' and he goes, and to another, 'Come,' and he comes, and to my slave, 'Do this,' and he does it." When Jesus heard him, he marveled, and said to those who followed him, "Truly, I say to you, not even in Israel have I found such faith. I tell you, many will come from east and west and sit at table with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven, while the sons of the kingdom will be thrown into the outer darkness; there men will weep and gnash their teeth." And to the centurion Jesus said, "Go; be it done for you as you have believed." And the servant was healed at that very moment.




