The Epistle – Galatians 6:11-18

Brethren, see with what large letters I am writing to you with my own hand. It is those who want to make a good showing in the flesh that would compel you to be circumcised, and only in order that they may not be persecuted for the cross of Christ. For even those who receive circumcision do not themselves keep the law, but they desire to have you circumcised that they may glory in your flesh. But far be it from me to glory except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision counts for anything, nor uncircumcision, but a new creation. Peace and mercy be upon all who walk by this rule, upon the Israel of God. Henceforth let no man trouble me; for I bear on my body the marks of Jesus. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit, brethren. Amen.

The Gospel – John 3:13-17

The Lord said, "No one has ascended into heaven but he who descended from heaven, the Son of man who is in heaven. And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. For God so loved the world that he gave his only-begotten Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. For God sent the Son into the world, not to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."

Sunday School Begins Today – We are so excited to welcome your children into our Sunday School classrooms today! Our amazing teachers have been busy preparing fun and meaningful lessons to not only engage and teach your children, but more importantly to help them build relationships with one another and with our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Sunday School begins with the Liturgy. Children gain so much from hearing the prayers, seeing the icons, singing the hymns, listening to the Gospel, and taking communion. Like last year, when children arrive in time to hear the Gospel being read, they can put a sticker on their card in the Narthex and earn prizes!

Children will line up for communion first. If you have young children who need to be escorted to their classroom, you are welcome to commune with them. When ready, please exit the door near the choir, and head down the hall toward the classrooms. Children may select one treat from the snack table on their way to class.

Parents are then free to enjoy the end of Divine Liturgy and some coffee and conversation in the fellowship hall until 11:35am, when classes will conclude. Children in third grade and younger should be picked up by parents promptly from their classrooms. Older children will be dismissed independently, unless you make other arrangements with the teacher.

New for this Year:

- Our youngest classes (PreK through 3rd grade) will each get a rotating turn to sit in a reserved front-row pew with their teacher. This is a special opportunity for the children to see what happens during the liturgy from a great vantage point!
- Our weekly PreK class in room 206 will be limited to children who have turned 4 by September 1, 2024. Younger preschool children will be invited to come with a parent to the TOTS room after communion to enjoy some learning and play-stations together, providing a wonderful opportunity for parents to get to know one another.


- 1. Thu, 9/26 (immediately following evening Divine Liturgy) "The Lost Meaning of Baptism and Why it Matters"

Seeking Applications for Directors of the Holy Apostles Foundation


