owards the end of the celebration of the Divine Liturgy, the Priest reads the following prayer on behalf of those present in the Church that morning:

"Lord, bless those who praise You and sanctify those who trust in You. Save Your people and bless Your inheritance. Protect the whole body of Your Church. Sanctify those who love the beauty of Your house. Glorify them in return by Your divine power."

The Church in which we gather as the Body of Christ is the temple of God, His Holy House. And the Lord sanctifies - He makes holy - those who enter His House "with faith, reverence, and the fear of God."

It cannot be stressed enough that everyone, from infants to the elderly, receives sanctification and the grace of God in a unique and special way when they are worshipping in God's House.

is to be the place of My rest?" (Isaiah 66:1), has condescended to dwell among us in His Holy Church, the House of God. There the Immortal comes to the mortal, the Heavenly to the earthly, to hold converse and communion with us, His children.

Not only do we receive sanctification, grace, visitation, and divine power when gathering together in Church, but we also receive protection against Satan and his demons.

St. Ignatius of Antioch, writing at the turn of the first century AD, constantly told his flock: "Be diligent therefore and make sure to meet together frequently to offer the Eucharist to God and for His glory. For when you meet together frequently, the powers of Satan are cast down; and his mischief comes to nothing in the unity of your faith."

On the other hand, however, those who do not go to Church are deprived of any spiritual weaponry and of any spiritual defense against the enemy. Since spiritual strength derives from participation in the liturgical and sacramental life of the Church, absent Christians are weakened by not going to Church.

The devil therefore gains a great advantage over such people, and they become even more susceptible to his attacks. Worse yet, those who separate themselves from the Church and Her gatherings prefigure the great separation that will take place by the Lord at His Second Coming, when the sheep are placed at His right, and the goats at His left.

Speaking to those who voluntarily absent themselves from Church, St. Nikodemos says, "The willful separation which you do now from the Church is a prefigurement of that separation which you will receive then."

For all these reasons then, and for many more which I have not touched on, we should always be anxious and desirous to go to Church.

According to the Holy Fathers of our faith, the Church is Heaven on earth, a beautiful city, a celebration, Paradise, a fortress, the Ark of Salvation, and salvation itself.

The Church is our Mother from whom we received new spiritual life in Baptism and by whom we are constantly nurtured and nourished through the Holy Mysteries and divine teachings.

In Psalm 84, the Psalmist cries out: "How lovely is Your dwelling place, O Lord of hosts! My soul longs, yea, faints for the courts of the Lord. Blessed are those who dwell in Your house, ever singing Your praise! A day in Your courts is better than a thousand elsewhere."

If King David longed to worship God so much in the old Temple under the Old Covenant, how much more should we Christians, who are under the New Covenant of Jesus Christ's blood, desire to gather together as the Body of Christ?

Remember these things, brothers and sisters, as the days of summer approach. It is easy to forget about God and His House with vacations and summer projects and so many other distractions. But I imagine we will continue to eat and drink to sustain our bodies, or go to the doctor when we are sick, etc.

So please let us not forget about our soul which needs its own spiritual food and drink to survive and maintain its health. Church is a great joy and necessary for the continuance of our life in Christ – even in the summer.

Wishing you a wonderful and productive summer, I leave you with these inspiring words of St. Nikodemos the Hagiorite: "If you run with desire to the earthly courts of the Lord, you will blossom there above in the heavenly courts of God.

"And if you frequent the earthly temple of God and worship Him with fear and devotion, know that God will make you a pillar in His heavenly temple, and you shall never leave there unto the ages: 'He who conquers, I will make him a pillar in the temple of My God and never shall he go out of it' (Rev. 3:12)."





PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE MAY 2025 PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

PC SECRETARY: PATTY PAPPAS | EDITED BY: VAL DRANIAS

Call to Order: Jim Maragos. Opening Prayer: Father George. Recite Mission Statement

Approval of Minutes: Steve Milak. Motion (Steve, Sandy): To approve the minutes from the April Parish Council meeting. PASSED

Correspondence: Jim Maragos

Thank you note from Eleni Geanon for the Holy Week bonus. Received statement from Vanessa's Clohessy's firm indicating she is not billing for services. Athenian foods soliciting for business.

Ecclesiastical Report: Father George. Fr. George shared a Pastristix film on the Ascension: The Ascension Icon.

Ministries

Finance: George Antonopoulos – prior written report. George A. read out the April Financial Report, focusing on cash balances in capital and operating categories. Jim M. shared that the Holy Week totals came in at \$35k. Lou clarified that the amount is net of the amounts donated to IOCC and HCHC. George shared that he is working on the Allocation Report and that the church will file for a 1-week extension to work out some open questions.

Stewardship: Sandy Pihos - prior written report. Sandy P. read out the stewardship report. Shared that we are slightly below where we'd want to be, but tracking close year over year.

Building & Grounds: Chris Pepke. No report for this meeting.

Ushering: Ted Dres - Holy Week Review and Father Nicholas. Ted D. shared that in his opinion Holy Week ushering operations went smoothly. Fr. Nicholas credited Dr. Bell with the sheets he prepared to organize the Parish Council. Fr. Nicholas emphasized going back by the altar to check-in with the priests to see if there are any last-minute changes. Sandy P. emphasized that the UIC must read the playbooks ahead of time and to be sure to check-in with the priest as Fr. Nicholas mentioned. Other pain points and positive affirmations were discussed.

Old Business

Church Picnic Sunday June 1: Sandy Pihos. Sandy P. reported that the picnic is very well organized. The food will be served from inside the building this year. Rationale is a more streamlined and better quality food experience. It was reported that many didn't realize the picnic was June 1st this year; to mitigate advertising was done via the bulletin and other channels. Fr. George asked for clarification on the flow from the end of liturgy until the start of the picnic, noting it is also graduate Sunday. Sandy will touch base with Mike to coordinate logistics and inform Fr. George how things will flow.

Front office Associate position: Sandy Pihos. Sandy P. reported that the committee has interviewed four people. No candidate has been found. The committee is working on modifying their approach to improve the pipeline of candidates.

Lemus Janitorial Contract: Jim Maragos/Lou Kafkes. Previous motion on 1/16/25 was to negotiate a new contract with a 6% raise for this year and 3% thereafter. Lou reported that the contract is ready for execution and not another review.Lots of discussion ensued on whether, based on the motion from the previous meeting, the contract could be executed or whether it would need to be approved. The motion from the January meeting was read indicating it was for a "negotiated" contract. Based on this, it seemed well to the council that the contract could move forward.

Greek School contracts: Nicole Ostendorf. Zoe is working on collecting the new contracts of the teachers.

Youth Worker Training report: Father George. Shared that there were 3 individuals that were non-compliant. Two are working towards compliance, one individual is unknown. Two people from the youth workers that have not registered; Lou is working on informing them of the requirement. Eight others will soon fall out of compliance due to hitting the 1 year expiration.

Cemetery plots: Sandy Pihos. Sandy shared the submitted cemetery report. Sandy shared that it appears new interest is being generated in purchasing the remaining plots.

Holy Apostles Parish will commemorate the Feast Day of the Holy Apostles beginning with a Great Vesper Service on Sunday, June 29 at 7:00 PM. We are looking forward to hearing who will be delivering an inspirational homily that evening, followed by a reception in the Multipurpose Room.

On Monday morning, June 30, at 9:00 AM we will gather and celebrate the Divine Liturgy and honor those Apostles, who like us, were given gifts by the Lord and who worked together, to live their faith and share their blessings. This service will be followed by a Fellowship Coffee Hour.

Artoclasias will honor our Holy Apostles at both services. The blessing of the five loaves is reminiscent of the five loaves that Jesus blessed in the desert and by which five thousand were fed. We look forward to gathering as a Holy Apostles Family to revere this special occasion.

THE PRIEST'S BLESSING

Did you know that when we greet a priest, we meet Christ? When approaching a priest, we are not merely interacting with a man. We are engaging with Christ Himself.

This is why we ask for the priest's blessing and do not simply shake hands and say "Hi". A priest is ordained to make Christ present in a unique way. Through the grace of God, a priest receives the power of the Holy Spirit to celebrate the services and the Holy Sacraments of the Church, which only he can do.

When the priest celebrates a Liturgy, it is Christ celebrating. When the priest administers a sacrament, Christ acts through him. \sim

When a priest blesses us, he forms with his fingers the Greek letters IC XC, which are the first and last letters of the Greek words Ιησους Χριστός ("lesous Christos") — Jesus Christ.

This symbolic gesture signifies that it is Christ Himself who blesses us. Therefore, we approach the priest and receive his blessing with reverence.

To ask for a blessing, we either place our open right hand into our open left hand or only offer our open right hand and say, "Father bless" to a priest and "Master bless" to a bishop or "Your blessings" (in Greek: $T\eta\nu \ \epsilon\nu\chi\eta \ \sigma\alpha\varsigma$).

The priest or bishop will make the Sign of the Cross and place his hand in ours. We then kiss his hand. We put our right hand in our left because it symbolizes Christ's victory over evil. We offer our open hand as a sign of respect and to communicate our willingness to receive the grace of God
