The Epistle – 1 Corinthians 6: 12-20

Brethren, "all things are permitted for me," but not all things are helpful. "All things are permitted for me," but I will not be enslaved by anything. "Food is meant for the stomach and the stomach for food" — and God will destroy both one and the other. The body is not meant for immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. And God raised the Lord and will also raise us up by his power. Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Shall I therefore take the members of Christ and make them members of a prostitute? Never! Do you not know that he who joins himself to a prostitute becomes one body with her? For, as it is written, "The two shall become one flesh." But he who is united to the Lord becomes one spirit with him. Shun immorality. Every other sin which a man commits is outside the body; but the immoral man sins against his own body. Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, which you have from God? You are not your own; you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body and in your spirit which belong to God.

The Gospel – Luke 15: 11-32

The Lord said this parable: "There was a man who had two sons; and the younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of the property that falls to me.' And he divided his living between them. Not many days later, the younger son gathered all he had and took his journey into a far country, and there he squandered his property in loose living. And when he had spent everything, a great famine arose in that country, and he began to be in want. So he went and joined himself to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him into his fields to feed swine. And he would gladly have filled his belly with the pods that the swine ate; and no one gave him anything. But when he came to himself he said, 'How many of my father's hired servants have bread enough and to spare, but I perish here with hunger! I will arise and go to my father, and I will say to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son; treat me as one of your hired servants.' And he arose and came to his father. But while he was yet at a distance, his father saw him and had compassion, and ran and embraced him and kissed him. And the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son.' But the father said to his servants, 'Bring quickly the best robe, and put it on him; and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet; and bring the fatted calf and kill it, and let us eat and make merry; for this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found.' And they began to make merry. Now his elder son was in the field; and as he came and drew near to the house, he heard music and dancing. And he called one of the servants and asked what this meant. And he said to him, 'Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fatted calf, because he has received him safe and sound.' But he was angry and refused to go in. His father came out and entreated him, but he answered his father, 'Lo, these many years I have served you, and I never disobeyed your command; yet you never gave me a kid, that I might make merry with my friends. But when this son of yours came, who has devoured your living with harlots, you killed for him the fatted calf!' And he said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. It was fitting to make merry and be glad, for this your brother was dead, and is alive; he was lost, and is found.'"


Project HOPE Update: The Hillside Food Pantry (HFP), which operates out of Immanuel Lutheran Church Church one block to the north of us, has been the recipient of our Project HOPE Bags for several years. HFP hosts a monthly drive-thru food pantry, no questions asked. Below is a "Thank You" and summary of the Holy Apostles donations from the Hillside Food Pantry Director.

In 2025, 3950 pounds of food were received between HOPE Bags and purchased food (like the Holiday Food Collection). This roughly translates to 3292 meals. The Holy Apostles Project HOPE Team thanks the community for their support of this ministry. It clearly has an impact on our neighbors in need. Let us strive to do even more in 2026. He has experience visiting with children, people with disabilities, nursing homes residents, and people with dementia. 



Building Homes. Transforming Lives. Serving Christ.

Project Mexico and St. Innocent Orphanage is an Orthodox Christian nonprofit dedicated to transforming lives through service, shelter, and faith. Since 1988 they have built 450+ homes for impoverished families in Mexico and provided loving care, education, and spiritual guidance to orphaned and vulnerable children.

Homebuilding is more than just construction, it's a life-changing experience. A team of Holy Apostles parishioners will travel to Northern Mexico, to build a safe and secure home for an impoverished family. The home is built entirely with volunteer labor. No prior construction experience necessary. You will be housed in tents on a campground on the property shared with the St Innocent Orphanage.

The trip is open to:

- Parishioners of Holy Apostles Greek Orthodox Church
- Individual participants should be 18 years of age or older
- Participants between 12-17 years must be accompanied by a parent or guardian
- Orthodox Christian Fellowship (OCF) college chapter
- Mission-minded families and individuals

Thania Panopoulos (dpanopoulos@gmail.com) and Norm Pomrenning (pomrenning@comcast.com) will co-lead the team on this transformational journey. We encourage young adults to participate. Check out projectmexico.org.

The cost to participate in a Project Mexico Home Building Project is \$900 per person. This cost includes building materials, three meals per day, tools, supplies, staffing and other costs necessary to sustain the program. Additionally, participants are responsible for their roundtrip flight from Chicago to San Diego.

Holy Apostles will be supporting this trip through free will contributions from parishioners. Money raised for this trip will be applied to the associated costs. Net proceeds from the Macaronatha Luncheon, February 22nd, will help defray some expenses for the Project Mexico team.
